Ripe but medium-weight, impeccably well balanced but with its character fully intact. Nothing is left to chance: it's expressive of assorted spices, fruits, leathers and woods, but it's simultaneously neat, fresh and finely stitched. Elegant, even. It doesn't just take a series of right steps; it doesn't take any wrong or even questionable ones. The length and class of the finish isn't just unsurprising then; it feels, as you swallow, inevitable. It will continue to impress for decades

Deep, rich red colour with a tinge of purple; the bouquet is lush and ripe, chocolaty and decadently complex, with plenty of oak evident, vanilla and chocolate and also hints of spices and even pepper. The palate is full-bodied, deep and mouth-filling: a really gorgeous, ample, decadent shiraz, with fleshy softness and density and tremendous persistence. It's superb, but they have used a lot of oak.

I've spent the best part of 24 hours assessing this 2013 release of Langi Shiraz and, as they say in the classics, the pleasure has been all mine.

It's peppery but not sneezily so. It's ripe and bold but not exaggeratedly so. It shows earth and undergrowth notes, but not to a challenging degree, and in any case the veneer of cedar/spicy oak keeps the train of flavour rolling smoothly along. You can enjoy it as a well-proportioned red wine, or you can pause to notice its more intricate details; it safely treads both paths. Many, many years ahead of it.

The wine is a dark red in the glass, initially muted with time brambly dark fruits and savoury spice can be found. The palate is supple and spicy, yet at the same time maintaining drying and earthen tannins. There is undoubtedly some quality oak that is at play, giving a sheath of richness to dark fruits to finish. Will reward time in the cellar.

Deep purple-black in color, the 2013 Shiraz Langi is a little shy on the nose at this early stage, revealing notes of fresh blackcurrant, black cherries and wild blueberries with hints of black pepper, mocha and cedar. Medium-bodied, taut and muscular in the mouth, it has a firm backbone of finely grained tannins and plenty of freshness to see it through the long haul. It should reward cellaring of 5-15 more years+.
